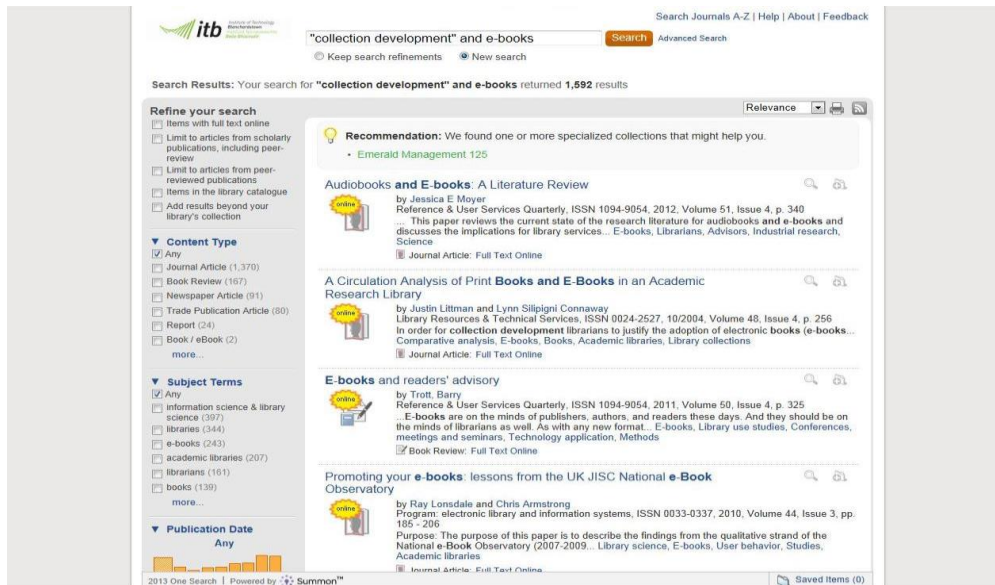


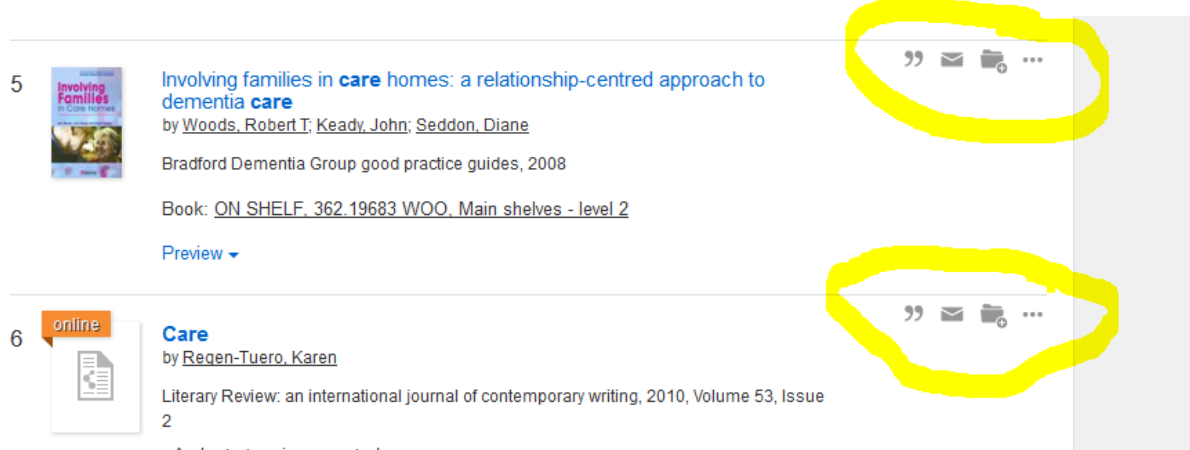
Importing references from One Search into RefWorks

Search for your books and Articles **One Search** in the usual way:

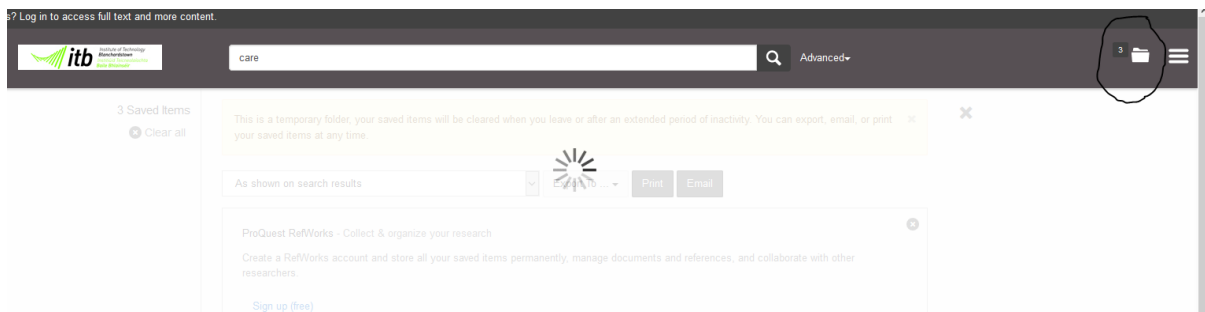


You must add each reference, which you wish to import into RefWorks, to the Saved Items folder. This folder is active for the duration of the session.

Click on the **Save this item** icon beside each article.

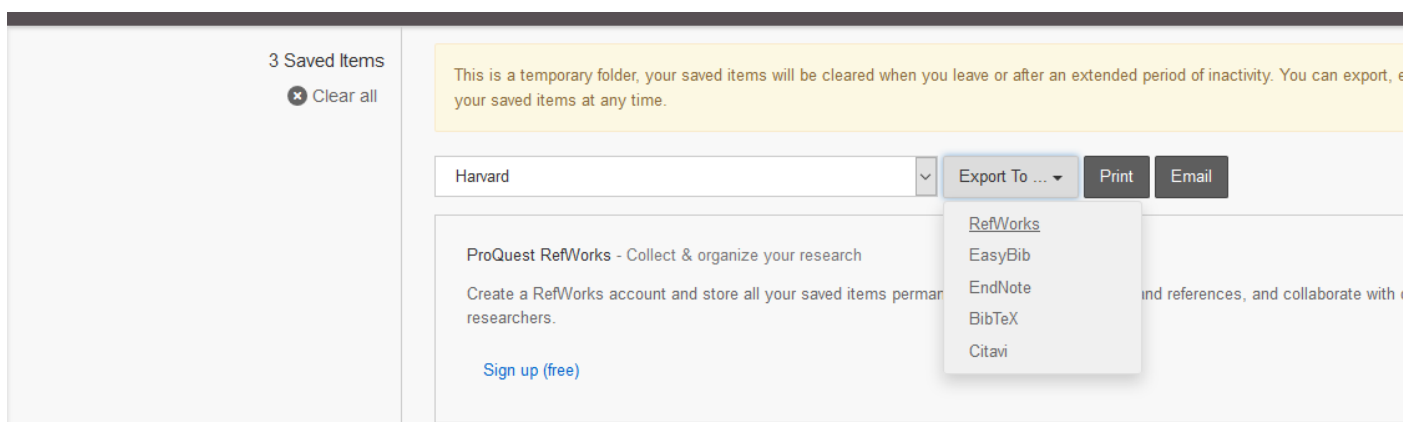


Note that each reference is added to the **Saved Items** folder at the top of the page:



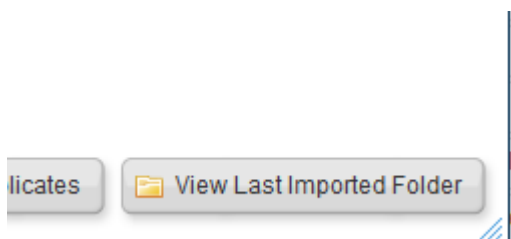
Click on the **Saved Items** folder when all your references have been added.

Choose “Refworks” in the “Export To” dropdown menu:



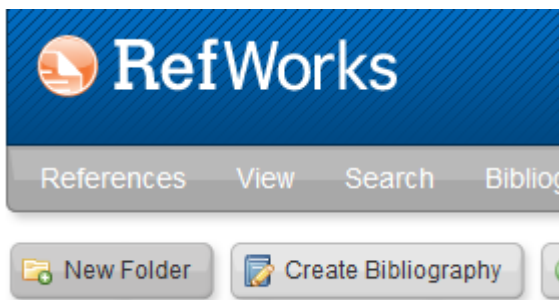
Log into Refworks using your username and password. If you haven't already got one, you need to sign up for an account using your ITB student Email address. (If you are prompted for a “Group code” its **RWBlanchardstownIT**)

A window opens in your RefWorks account noting that references have been imported. Click on the “View Last Imported Folder” button:

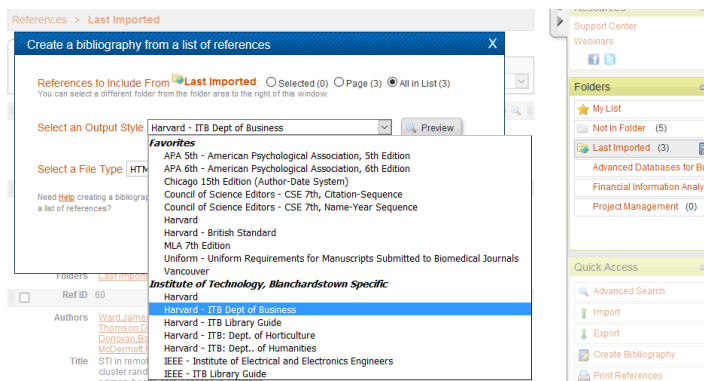


The references will appear in the list on screen.

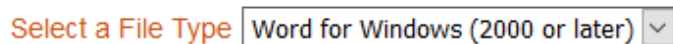
To create a bibliography, simply click the “Create Bibliography” button at the top of the page:



A window will open prompting you to choose the style of referencing you wish to use. There are subject specific styles, specific to ITB already pre-installed. Choose the relevant type from the drop down menu:



Choose the Microsoft word option from the “Select File Type” drop down menu:

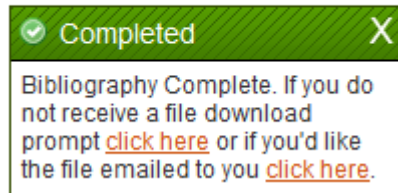


Need [Help](#) creating a bibliography? Did you want to [format a paper and bibliography](#) instead of creating a bibliography from a list of references?

Click the “Create Bibliography” button:



A message will pop up in the bottom right hand corner prompting you to download the Word Document. Follow the instructions:



Your references will then open in MS Word ready for you to copy and paste into the Bibliography section of your assignment:
