REFERENCING A SAMPLE BOOK SOURCE IN AN ESSAY: 3 OPTIONS

1. Provide the quote in inverted commas followed by the author and date and page:

'Stratification by gender is a feature of most societies' (Browne 2010, p.78).

(Author's surname + date + comma + page number) + full stop.

2. Start the sentence with the author's name followed by date, page and then the quote:

Browne (2010, p.78) states that 'stratification by gender is a feature of most societies'.

Author as the subject of the sentence (date + comma + page number)

3. Paraphrase the information in the quote and provide the author date and the page if the information is specific:

Browne (2010, p.78) observes that the status of men and women can be quite different in most societies.

Author as the subject of the sentence (date + comma + page number)
